Mayor's Message

Thanks again to Mike, Dave, & Terry for all their help with watering and caring for the flower baskets over the summer. And thanks to everyone else who helped make that project such a success, particularly the North Powder FFA for donating the baskets.

Thank you to everyone who has donated to the Christmas Celebration project. We are in the process of building a permanent in-ground stand for the City Christmas tree. We are still accepting donations for new lights for the tree and for the wreaths. Anyone wishing to make a donation can do so at City Hall. Our annual Christmas Celebration will be Sunday, December 10th starting with a lighted parade at 5PM, followed by the tree lighting and caroling at City Hall, finishing with a hayride to the Rural Fire Station for a chili feed.

We hope to start installing the wiring for new street lights sometime within the next few weeks. If you would like to volunteer to help with this project, please contact City Hall.

The City has purchased a small used dump-truck. We plan to purchase a blade so that it can be used to plow snow in place of the big orange dump truck.

Once again, I would like to remind everyone as you prepare for winter, please don't forget to move all vehicles and items off the city right-of-ways (streets and alleys) so they are not in the way of the snow plows. And please keep your things clear of fire hydrants.

Wastewater Project

As the Wastewater System Improvement Project nears completion, the City Council will hold a 2nd Public Hearing to obtain public comment about the project.

The project was primarily funded by a Community Development Block Grant. The Public Hearing will be Monday, November 6, 2023 at City Hall during the regular Council meeting at 7PM. Written comments may be submitted to City Hall no later than 12:30PM on Friday, November 3rd, or mailed to PO Box 309, or emailed to cityofnp@eoni.com. Oral comments will be accepted at the hearing.

Public Hearing

The City Council will hold a Public Hearing at 6PM on Monday, November 6, 2023, at City Hall to consider applications for a Conditional Use Permit for a new City Library and a Variance for Off-Street Parking.

City Zoning Ordinance #1983-3 identifies a Public Institutional Facility (such as a library) as a Conditional Use in the Public Zone.

The City Council will also consider an application for a Variance regarding Off-Street parking for the new library. Copies of the applications and information related to the applications can be reviewed at City Hall during business hours, Monday thru Friday.

Persons wishing to comment may submit written comments to City Hall (340 E Street) no later than 12:30PM on Friday, November 3. Written comments may also be submitted by mail at PO Box, emailed to cityofnp@eoni.com or presented at the hearing. You may also testify in person at the hearing. Comments received over the phone or in conversation will NOT be considered by the council as a basis for appeal.

Dogs

The City has been getting a lot of complaints about dogs, again.

Please do not let your dogs roam free. City and County ordinances require that all dogs must be under control at all times.

This means either by physical means, such as on a leash or contained by a fence, or by voice or signal from a person capable of controlling the dog.

Dogs are NOT allowed to run at large. They cannot be on the premises of a person other than that of the animal owner without the consent of another owner or occupant. Dogs are NOT allowed in the City Park, cemetery, school grounds, or other public grounds.

If you take your dog for a walk, please clean up after them.

You are not allowed to have more than 3 dogs per residence, regardless of how many dog owners may live there. More than 3 dogs per residence requires a Kennel License.

If your dog bites or harms a person or another animal it is considered to be a public nuisance and may be, by order of Municipal Court, removed from the city or destroyed.

All dogs in Union County over 6 months of age or have a set of permanent canine teeth are required to be licensed. Licenses may be obtained from the Union County Sheriff's office.

If you have a complaint about a dog, please contact the Union County Animal Control at 541-963-1017.

City Hall Meeting Room

Work has begun on the City Hall Meeting Room. The division wall between the meeting room and the proposed new library has been erected and the frame work to replace the roll-up door is done. New windows will be installed in the front of the building to match those at City Hall. The windows in the back will also be replaced.

The meeting room will be accessible from City Hall, from E Street and from the new library.

The proposed plan will eventually include a unisex handicap accessible restroom and a small vestibule that will be accessed for both the meeting room and the new library.
