Wastewater Project

The City Council held a second Public Hearing on Monday, November 6th to hear comments from the public regarding the Wastewater System Improvement Project.

The City is temporarily operating under two DEQ permits— an NPDES permit to discharge effluent water to the river and a WPCF permit to discharge to the new evaporation pond. In a few months when everything for the evaporation pond has been tested and assured that it is all working correctly, we will discontinue the NPDES permit.

A Bio Solids Removal Plan has been submitted to DEQ. The plan is to dredge the wastewater ponds and to apply the sludge in liquid form at an approved site no later than September 15, 2024. A Bio Solids Management Plan is due March 1, 2024. The city has approximately \$80,000 left from the CDBG grant that can be applied to the cost of dredging and the Council has approved spending the remaining ARPA funds on the project. We also have an approved loan of \$390,000. Depending on how much sludge has to be removed at this time, we may have to look for additional funding.

Community Christmas

The Third Annual Community Christmas Celebration will be Sunday, December 10th. The Celebration will kick-off with a lighted Christmas parade at 5PM. Parade line up is at 4:45PM in front of the old high school, on G Street. No registration is required and anyone can enter. We just ask that your entry be lighted as the parade route will be kind of dark. The parade will go down 2nd Street from G Street to E Street and will end at City Hall (340 E Street) where activities will continue with caroling, tree lighting, and decorating the tree. Everyone is encouraged to bring a special ornament to hang on the City tree. Following the tree lighting, the Rural Fire District will offer hayrides to transport folks to (and from) the fire station for free chili and hot chocolate and a visit from Old St. Nick. Everyone is invited to join us for a fun filled Community Christmas Celebration!

License & Permit Renewals

It is time to start thinking about business license and burn permit renewals. All city business licenses must be renewed no later than January 31, 2024, regardless of the date it was issued. All businesses operating in the city limits are required to have a business license. The annual fee is \$15 and due no later than January 31st. A \$10 late fee will be applied to any license not renewed by the due date.

ALL burn permits expire as of January 1st. Again, it doesn't matter when they were issued in the previous year, they are only valid thru December of that year. Burn permits are required for any type of burning done within City limits. There is no charge for a burn permit. Permits are available at City Hall.

Santa Shop

The annual "Santa Shop" will be Wednesday, December 6th at the Wolf Creek Grange. North Powder elementary classes K -5 will be scheduled to visit the Santa Shop throughout the day during school hours. Air Purifiers

The Northeast Oregon Network (NEON) is committed to creating a healthier Eastern Oregon by helping to reduce barriers that support health. One of the many ways they are doing this is by providing FREE air purifiers to qualifying residents of Union, Baker and Wallowa Counties. To qualify, you must be someone of low income, a senior citizen, veteran, or someone who has issues with air quality. You cannot be on the Oregon Health Plan, as there is an avenue for you to receive a unit thru OHP (NEON can help you with that).
